ISTORIAN'S COMMENTS:
LTC John Hamilton (Ret)
shares the following:
History Note #19
The Hike from Orogrande Range Camp.

World War II brought about the massive mobilization of units for war on two fronts, which in turn brought about the sea change to Fort Bliss. The 1st Cavalry Division, formed from the cavalry regiments patrolling the border before 1921, was dismounted, trained as an infantry division, and sent to fight in the Southwest Pacific.

In its place came thousands of antiaircraft troops to organize, train, and deploy from Logan Heights above Fort Bliss. Many regiments, battalions, and higher headquarters started life from virtually nothing on Fort Bliss.

One of these was the 113th Coast Artillery Battalion (Antiaircraft), formed out of draftees and led by a cadre of leaders drawn from other previously formed units. The battalion activated on February 10, 1943 as 113th Coast Artillery Battalion (AA) (Gun) (Mobile) at Fort Bliss, TX under the authority of Headquarters, AA Command, Richmond, VA. This was a 90mm gun battalion, separate, fully mobile until March 15, 1944, when it was made semimobile. The only difference was that fully mobile battalions could move with organic trucks in one lift, whereas semimobile battalions had to move in multiple lifts or with additional truck or tractor vehicles.

This battalion arrived after organizing at Camp Grant, Illinois, with draftees who had driven bakery trucks, assistant chemists, lathe operators, former policemen, trade school and college students, soda jerks, office clerks, and others from all over the United States. Upon arriving by train, the troops were trucked to Logan Heights, assigned to headquarters battery or one of three 90mm gun batteries, and lodged in the

six-man huts on the Heights. Then came basic training for the troops, then crew training, then movement from the remote location of Logan Heights to the more remote location of Orogrande Range Camp, 50 miles to the north on Highway 54. There the troops did battery live firing by day and night, incorporation of radar, and foot marches. And more foot marches. The culmination of this training made history with a foot march along Highway 54 toward Logan Heights. Most of the troops were picked up along the way using battalion trucks.

Four stalwart troops made the entire trip on foot, however. Lieutenant A.J. Touart and Private Nicholas Radakovich, Harry E. Briney, and William Roelse walked the entire 50 miles in 16 hours and ten minutes. They carried their personal equipment, including ammunition belt, suspenders, gas masks, and one canteen of water each. They made several stops enroute, the longest being 45 minutes. The four had lunch at Newman, New Mexico, 15 miles from camp. This was done in April 1943, not the hottest time of the year, but they did have to endure a dust storm over the last 15 miles. All four men were 20 years old, and they were all from the Midwest. Their arrival at Logan Heights was greeted by cheers from the massed battalion and the

Antiaircraft Command commander. The Fort Bliss News printed this as a front-page story, but the El Paso newspapers did not cover this event.

The battalion went on to serve in North Africa, England, France, and Belgium. Lt. Touart earned the Bronze Star medal. The battalion's biggest combat mission was against the V-1 buzz bombs after the Battle of the Bulge. Nine soldiers earned the Purple Heart for wounds in action. War's end found them guarding a German POW camp at Marseilles, where the battalion was broken up by the departure of soldiers to civilian life following the point system for war returnees.
