HOMELAND SECUITY MINUTE

In the news or on social media, you often see stories about the large number of firearms being bought by first time gun owners. I would like to go over the basic rules of gun safety. To do this, I am going to draw heavily from the writings of LtCol Jeff Cooper, USMC. He is considered the creator of the "modern technique" of handgun shooting and a true expert in the handling of arms.

Jeff Cooper laid out four "golden rules" for gun safety*. He did not quibble and he did not hesitate to explain that these rules must be engrained in the character of everyone who handles firearms.

- **1.All guns are ALWAYS LOADED**. Ignore this rule at your and everyone else's peril. A firearm is only safe when it is not in someone's hand.
- **2. Never let the muzzle of your weapon cover anything you are not willing to destroy!** This is especially true when returning your weapon to its holster. Too often, shooters let the muzzle pass over a thigh or foot, occasionally with dire consequences.
- **3.Keep your finger off the trigger until your sights are on the target**. A modern firearm will not discharge unless someone pulls the trigger. Even in the midst of imminent danger, no finger on the trigger until your sights are on the target...**Always**!
- **4. Be sure of your target** and what is behind it. Know what you are aiming and shooting at! Be aware of your surroundings and do not assume anything. A catastrophic example of not following this rule occurred recently in California, where a member of a police response unit fired at a suspect with a rifle, missed, and killed a girl in a dressing room. When in doubt, don't shoot.

Keeping a firearm in the home is a personal responsibility. This is doubly so when children are present. Teenagers must be taught the skills of safe gun handling. Young children must be taught four simple rules. These rules come from the NRA. For whatever faults the NRA has, these are excellent rules to teach children:

If you see a gun:

a.Stop!

b.Don't Touch!

c.Run Away!

d.Tell an adult!

Please Google these rules for more information and learn to keep everyone safe around firearms.
