COMMANDER'S COMMENTS

I talked last time about membership, about what the chapter needs from the disengaged group who, for whatever reason, can, but are unable to, do for the chapter, and what the chapter can do for them in return. This time, I'd like to discuss recruiting.

Nationally, MOWW is faced with a dwindling membership, as older members die and are not replaced. This is true at the chapter level, as well, with 5 or more chapters closing annually. For years we've relied on "retail" recruiting to replenish our membership – one on one recruiting of friends, acquaintances and chance met individuals who meet our membership criteria. That's still a valid approach but isn't enough to fill the ranks. That being so, I'd like to explore what I call wholesale recruiting.

Wholesale recruiting, in my mind, is placing recruiters in high-traffic, "target rich" locations, preparing them with a "sales pitch" and recruiting materials, and relying on the innate curiosity of passers-by. In short, setting up a table at, for example, the PX/BX complex at our local military installations and presenting MOWW to those curious enough to stop and talk. It's also getting permission to place recruiting materials on unit bulletin boards and in other high traffic locations on the installations. Both approaches require that we have – or make - contacts on the installation and that we receive permission to post our materials and set up our table. They also require members willing to man the table and and handle the initial contacts.

Who are we looking for? For the time-being, our peer group of officers and warrant officers, active, retired, reserve, guard or former. We should probably look for younger individuals, younger being a relative term, given the ages of most of our membership. Let's just stick with younger meaning younger than we are. We need to look for people willing to commit to the Order's principles and to embrace the tenets set forth in the Preamble, who have and are willing to devote time and effort to MOWW's programs. In my view, the ideal candidate would be a mid-career officer – probably an O-4 or a W-3, or somebody about to retire, who's looking to do something for his community.

Here, as last time, I'd like to have your thoughts and comments on how we should go about recruiting new members. It's clear, I think, that we can't continue to rely on retail recruiting alone, that we must also have a wholesale approach, but what that approach should be is still an open question. Think of what you'd say about MOWW to a potential member if you had only the time it takes an elevator to go between floors, to somebody in a checkout line or asking questions at a recruiting table. What "target rich" environments are out there that we might tap for possible members? Should we advertise? If so, how and where?

I look forward to hearing from you on this important topic.
