COMMANDER'S REPORT:

Greetings to everyone, as we begin easing back into our usual MOWW operational year activities. Our chapter representatives have returned from this year's national convention in Pennsylvania and have lots to share with us – so please take a moment to review this month's updates in this month's edition. Sharing some big news, historic legislation occurred in King of Prussia this year, with the formal voting in of much needed membership reform to our Order's long-standing membership policy. Most intriguing, was that the proposed top-3 senior NCO amendment was challenged by a floor change to further broaden the membership aperture to include "all veterans" which made it through the 50% election hurdle to change the proposed amendment; however, it failed to pass the 75% election threshold by only a single .5% (or one more individual "YAY" vote). Having missed being passed by the slimmest of election voting margin is most telling. Regardless, with the failure of the proposed amendment change, the initial amendment was once again reinstated and did pass the 75% election voting threshold and is now in effect throughout the Order. More details are provided in the Adjutant's report. We are off to a great start, as our chapter is currently processing four new companion chapter-sponsored regular membership applications, as of the writing of this newsletter entry.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

Our current 2024-2025 operating year Chapter CHASE bank account balance, as of the end of August remains at SAVINGS - \$699.99 / CHECKING - \$588.46 USDs. The Chapter AZYLC Program Fundraising Campaign US Bank account balance is \$5,059.68 USDs. The next significant account deposit will be for this coming DEC 2024, when a grant donation check deposit, from the annual Country Fair White Elephant Grant Committee non-profit organization in Green Valley, AZ will have its end-of-calendar-year grant donation distribution event. The second chapter donation possibility will be sometime in the new calendar year pending HQ MOWW approval. The Chapter is also reaching out to fellow companions in hopes of collecting some donations throughout the year and is planning a chapter fundraising event for the upcoming annual national convention for AUG 2025.

ADJUTANT'S REPORT:

As already mentioned in the Chapter Commander's comments entry, MOWW membership policy has been changed to now allow the recruitment of E7, E8, and E9 senior non-commissioned officers into our chapter ranks. There is also a concerted interest in readdressing further membership reform change to allow all veterans to our Order for next year's convention in Tucson, AZ. To help prepare and posture for this possibly anticipated action for the next convention, the senior MOWW leadership is asking all Order chapters to maximize their chapter category newly recruited companion stated thresholds (i.e., small chapters need to recruit two [2] new members each operating year, medium chapters need to recruit six [6] new members, and large chapters need to recruit twelve [12] new members – if addressing further membership reform expansion is to make it past the MOWW Constitutions and Bylaws Committee screening process during the new calendar year. Our chapter is well on our way to meeting our six new member goal by the mid-operating year point at the end of DEC 2024. All current chapter operational seasonal checklist requirements (i.e., submission of our accepted IRS 990N and installations of the new operating year chapter leadership) is completed. Our 2024-2025 OY Chapter Action Plan is currently under development and will be published in our next monthly newsletter. Please stay tuned for further chapter projects and activity calendar events planning updates.







CHAPLAIN'S CORNER


Psalm 89:1-2





MONTHLY FEATURED ARTICLE

High Altitude Forecasting School

The Specialized High Altitude Forecasting school was very different. Chanute AFB's Weather Observer, Weather Equipment Teletype Technician, and Forecaster schools each had about a hundred students with little meteorological experience. This new Chanute school, in 1950, had only about ten.



All were experien c e d forecast ers. I was a staff sergeant and as I

recall the only enlisted man. The others were lieutenants and captains, we all enjoyed these six weeks of escaping air base flight forecasting stress. We had light tables upon which we drew the 300 millibar charts and some 500 millibar charts. The instructor, a colonel, liked having new ideas presented. In one exercise, we overlaid the current 500 millibar chart upon its 24-hour-old version. Connecting their intersections resulted in a new chart. Some of the students thought that new chart had predictive value. My reputation as a map drawer had pre-ceded my arrival, and I thought that map quite useless. Several times the instructor called for my opinion regarding other map exercises. We drew many maps, some I thought also unnecessary; but I made up a chart involving vorticity, a point in the atmosphere having a tendency for spin. I believed vorticity might be spotted on a routine chart even before a low pressure cell showed, taking that point forward in time to yet a newer map. The instructor thought it interesting and asked me to explain it to the class. They looked dumbfounded. Privately, I agreed it was crazy. This was a time before computers, no good radar, no satellites. I was just trying a somewhat science-based idea in the hope it might assist forecasters. Our class had one student who could make a joke out of



anything. He was a reserve captain and a weathercaster on an Oklahoma City TV channel. I didn't know if that was his real name or his TV persona. Wally coined the term "spaghetti charts," referring to the myriad maps we drew including my vorticity-idea chart. We enjoyed his jokes and respected his experience. He had been in a German POW camp, playing a horn to keep German guards from hearing others dig an escape tunnel. Wally could have inspired this movie that came out 13 years after our high altitude school: *The Great Escape*. **TLC**

Ted transferred his chapter membership affiliation over to our chapter from the former Catalina Mountains Chapter which operated out of east Tucson until this past June 2022 when they ceased operations. AUGUST IN HISTORY

August 1

August 1, 1838 - Slavery was abolished in Jamaica. It had been introduced by Spanish settlers 300 years earlier in 1509.

August 1, 1944 - Anne Frank penned her last entry into her diary. "[I] keep on trying to find a way of becoming what I would like to be, and what I could be, if...there weren't any other people living in the world." Three days later, Anne and her family were arrested and sent to Nazi concentration camps. Anne died at Bergen-Belsen concentration camp on March 15, 1945, at age 15.

August 1, 1944 - The Warsaw Uprising began as the Polish Home Army, numbering about 40,000 Polish patriots, began shooting at German troops in the streets. The Nazis then sent eight divisions to battle the Poles, who had hoped for, but did not receive, assistance from the Allies. Two months later, the rebellion was quashed.

Birthday - *Star-Spangled Banner* author Francis Scott Key (1779-1843) was born in Frederick County, Maryland. After witnessing the British bombardment of Fort McHenry on the night of September 13-14, 1814, he was enthralled to see the American flag still flying over the fort at daybreak. He then wrote the <u>poem</u> originally entitled *Defense of Fort McHenry* which became the U.S. National Anthem in 1931.

Birthday - Moby Dick author Herman Melville (1819-1891) was born in New York.

August 2

August 2, 1776 - In Philadelphia, most of the 55 members of the Continental Congress signed the parchment copy of the <u>Declaration of Independence</u>.

August 2, 1923 - President <u>Warren G. Harding</u> died suddenly in a hotel in San Francisco while on a Western speaking tour. His administration had been tainted by the Teapot Dome political scandal and his sudden death prompted many unfounded rumors. He was succeeded the next day by <u>Calvin Coolidge</u>.

August 2, 1939 - Albert Einstein wrote a <u>letter to President Franklin D. Roosevelt</u> concerning the possibility of atomic weapons. "A single bomb of this type carried by boat and exploded in a port, might very well destroy the whole port together with some of the surrounding territory." Six years later, on August 6, 1945, the first Atomic Bomb, developed by the U.S., was dropped on the Japanese port of Hiroshima.

August 2, 1990 - The Iraqi army invaded Kuwait amid claims that Kuwait threatened Iraq's economic existence by overproducing oil and driving prices down on the world market. An Iraqi military government was then installed in Kuwait which was annexed by Iraq on the claim that Kuwait was historically part of Iraq. This resulted in Desert Shield, the massive Allied military buildup, and later the 100-hour war against Iraq, Desert Storm.

August 3

August 3, 1492 - Christopher Columbus set sail from Palos, Spain, with three ships, *Nina*, *Pinta* and *Santa Maria*. Seeking a westerly route to the Far East, he instead landed on October 12th in the Bahamas, thinking it was an outlying Japanese island.

Birthday - War correspondent Ernie Pyle (1900-1945) was born in Dana, Indiana. His syndicated column offered sympathetic insights into the experiences of common soldiers during <u>World War II</u>. He received a Pulitzer Prize for his reports of the bombing of London in 1940 and later war reports from Africa, Sicily, Italy and France. He was killed by machine-gun fire near Okinawa in the South Pacific on April 18, 1945.

Birthday - Gray Panthers founder Maggie Kuhn (1905-1995) was born in Buffalo, New York. After she was forced into mandatory retirement at age 65, she founded the Gray Panthers organization to fight age discrimination and succeeded in the banning of mandatory retirement in most professions.

MEET THE NEW NATIONAL LEADERSHIP



Lieutenant Colonel David J. Worley served as Military Order of the World Wars (MOWW) National Senior Vice Commander-in-Chief, while also serving on the National Strategic Planning Committee and the Membership Ad Hoc Committee, as well as a credentialed teacher on the National Patriotic Education Committee. His 27 years in the Air Force, which began in 1975 included eight years as an enlisted FAA certified Air Traffic Controller, and after attending Officer Training School in 1983 serving as a rated Air Battle Manager. Upon his military retirement, Lt Col Worley then spent over fourteen years instructing the Air Force Junior ROTC program at Crescenta Valley High School in La Crescenta, California before retiring in 2017. Lt Col Worley holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Professional Aeronautics from Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University, and a Master of Public Administration (MPA) degree from Troy State University. Lt Col Worley is the Assistant Director for Operations at the Thousand Oaks Youth Leadership Conference (TOYLC), has been on the TOYLC staff for over 10 years, and developed the TOYLC's current curriculum. As the 93rd Commander-in-Chief of the Order, he pledges his commitment to carry-on with the five-year revitalization plan that PCINC Okin initated in 2021 and has continued under the thoughtful leadership of CINC Perez. Our 2023-2025 Strategic Plan provides a roadmap for continuing our revitalization efforts, a roadmap that

Region and Chapters alike have implemented with enthusiasm and vigor. I want our Order to continue these vital efforts, efforts that are rooted in the Order's Preamable which defines our Order's core values: it is through the Preamable that the Order will continue to thrive and see our community outreach efforts grow in leaps and bounds.
