COMMANDER'S REPORT:

Greetings to everyone and pre-fall festivities to all. September was quite a busy month for our chapter, as we try to meet all our scheduled community support commitments and fellow chapter support event coverage as well. As the month concludes, our chapter has accomplished some monumental milestone! For starters, we were able to support both the first of two scheduled Massing of the Colors & Service of Remembrance MOWW signature events in central Arizona (Phoenix Chapter 092 hosted annual event in partnership and collaboration with the B.P.O.E. Phoenix Elks Club 335) and just last weekend our chapter also supported and was represented at the annual Massing of the Colors & Service of Remembrance in El Paso, Texas (Greater El Paso Chapter 070 hosted annual event along with their City of El Paso and El Paso Community College partners). To top this stellar support effort, our chapter for the first time in its operational history, recruited six new chapter companions (required by the MOWW stated chapter category goal) in a single month! Congratulations to all who have contributed to this extraordinary recruitment effort this operating year.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

Our current 2024-2025 operating year Chapter CHASE bank account balance, as of the end of August remains at SAVINGS - \$760.00 / CHECKING - \$588.46 USDs. The Chapter AZYLC Program Fundraising Campaign US Bank account balance is \$3,489.65 USDs. The next significant account deposit will be for this coming DEC 2024, when a grant donation check deposit, from the annual Country Fair White Elephant Grant Committee non-profit organization in Green Valley, AZ will have its end-of-calendar-year grant donation distribution event. The second chapter donation possibility will be sometime in the new calendar year pending HQ MOWW approval. The Chapter is also reaching out to fellow companions in hopes of collecting some donations throughout the year and is planning a chapter fundraising event for the upcoming annual national convention for AUG 2025.

ADJUTANT'S REPORT:

Our chapter is currently processing our sixth newly recruited fellow companion, for a total of six new companions thus far in the current 2024-2025 operating year. Among those newly recruited are three senior non-commissioned officers which are also an historical first for our chapter. Our chapter recruitment efforts have been nothing short of spectacular this operating year. We hope to make further recruitment milestones this year and we thank every fellow companion who contributed to our success. As the late fall and early winter months approach, there are a couple of important events on the calendar. These include our first of two Massing of the Colors (in east Tucson) scheduled for the first Sunday in November (5 NOV starting at 12PM) at the Tucson Women's Club on 22nd and Wilmot Rd. Our chapter is also hosting this operating year's Region XIII Winter Conference (16-19 JAN 2025) at the Desert Diamond Casino Hotel. This event serves as a small sampling dry run event of the much larger week-long MOWW national convention 2025 venue scheduled for 5-9 AUG 2025. 



R-13: QTR-1 VCC MTG - SEPT 2024

Our Chapter hosted the first of four quarterly Region XIII online planning meetings for the current 2024-2025 operating year. While the R-13 Commander position remains vacant, our local chapter has stepped up to assume some of the administrative duties for this very important and timely online planning session - in service to all fellow R-13 chapter commanders and their appointed staff members. Such meetings are great communication and coordination tools used frequently within our region team efforts.

MONTHLY FEATURED ARTICLE

Army Navy E-Flag

This was the summer of 1944. As a new high school graduate, too young to enlist, my first day as aircraft-parts I was on inspector in the plant where my father, Louis, machined engine parts for the B-29. That plane would cause the Japanese government to end organized fighting in World War II which led to the war's official end, on December 31, 1946. As I approached the war-plant gate, Old Glory proudly waved at me. But I was surprised to see a smaller, pennant-shaped flag, flying near it, red and blue with a large, white letter "E" in its center. During World War II, many changes were made as the



nation converted production plants to a war footing. To highlight superiorproduction efforts, the federal

government developed the Army-Navy E-Flag, the "E" standing for efficiency. Though called the "Army-Navy" flag, of course it also represented the Marine Corps of the Navy Department, and the Air Force, then part of the Army, as well as the Coast Guard and Merchant Marine. Through a hallway with posters having captions such as "Keep 'em Flying," a "Slip of the lip Will Sink a Ship," a plant guard hustled me into a training room. There, new hires, mostly young ladies, also recent high

school graduates, replaced men in military service. They used micrometers, vernier calipers, Rockwell hardness gauges and other inspection tools. Later, on the job, I met one of them, beautiful Marie Nordstrom, and still later, we would be married. The E-flag was also represented as a sticker, about the size of two postage stamps, and in the color of the actual flag. Plant secretaries would proudly affix it to correspondence. The sticker came with a banner stating: "Awarded for outstanding achievement in war production." Though we called them "war plants," the operations flying the flags were officially named "Defense Plants." Another change: the WWII-world became identified by war theater with the United States itself called "Zone of Interior" theater; and I enlisted in the Army Air Force, then coexistent with Army Air Corps, serving in Zone of Interior. Decades later, after being in USAF and Army artillery, at North America's largest copper producer, Arizona's Morenci mine, I started an environmental department and as an extra duty a company newsletter. While researching article material stored in an abandoned powder magazine, I found E-flag stickers, one of which is shown above. The mine once was a WWII Defense Plant that greatly increased production at direction of the federal government. It would have flown the E-flag at its mine gate. No surprise, you couldn't win the war without copper. In 1943, war-demand for copper had caused the U.S. penny to be made of steel, the only time that happened. TLC

SEPTEMBER IN HISTORY

September 1

September 1, 1715 - The "Sun King" (King Louis XIV of France) died. He had ruled since the age of five and was succeeded by his 5-year-old great-grandson Louis XV.

September 1, 1939 - At 5.30 a.m., Hitler's armies invaded Poland starting World War II in Europe.

September 1, 1969 - Military officers overthrew the Libyan government. The Libyan Arab Republic was then proclaimed under Colonel Muammar Gaddafi.

September 1, 1983 - Korean Air Lines Flight 007 was shot down by a Russian fighter jet while on route from New York to Seoul, killing all 269 persons on board. The Boeing 747 reportedly strayed 100 miles off course over secret Soviet Russian military installations on the Kamchatka Peninsula and Sakhalin Island. It crashed in the Sea of Japan.

Birthday - *Tarzan of the Apes* creator Edgar Rice Burroughs (1875-1950) was born in Chicago. Before becoming a novelist, he was as a correspondent for the *Los Angeles Times*.

Birthday - Boxing champ Rocky Marciano (1923-1969) was born in Brockton, Massachusetts (as Rocco Francis Marchegiano). He fought Jersey Joe Walcott for the heavyweight title on September 23, 1952, and knocked him out. In 1956, he retired as the only undefeated heavyweight champion. He died in a plane crash in 1969.

September 2

September 2, 31 B.C. - Roman legions under Augustus Caesar defeated Mark Anthony's naval force at Actium.

September 2, 1666 - The Great Fire of London began in a bakery in Pudding Lane near the Tower. Over the next three days more than 13,000 houses were destroyed, although only six lives were believed lost.

September 2, 1752 - The British ended their use of the Julian calendar, switching instead to the Gregorian calendar, resulting in a major adjustment as Wednesday, September 2, was followed by Thursday, September 14. The correction resulted in rioting by people who felt cheated and demanded the missing eleven days back.

September 2, 1789 - The third Presidential cabinet department, the U.S. Treasury, was established by Congress.

September 2, 1864 - During the American <u>Civil War</u>, <u>Atlanta</u> was captured by Sherman's Army. "Atlanta is ours, and fairly won," General <u>William T. Sherman</u> telegraphed <u>President Lincoln</u>.

September 2, 1870 - Napoleon III surrendered to the Prussians during the Battle of Sedan, resulting in the fall of the Second French Empire.

September 2, 1923 - The first elections were held in the Irish Free State after achieving independence from Britain.

September 2, 1930 - French aviators Dieudonne Coste and Maurice Bellonte made the first non-stop flight from Europe to the USA.

September 2, 1945 - President <u>Harry Truman</u> declared V-J Day (Victory over Japan Day) commemorating the formal <u>Japanese surrender</u> to the Allies aboard the USS *Missouri* in Tokyo Bay.

September 2, 1945 - Ho Chi Minh proclaimed the independence of Vietnam and the establishment of the Democratic Republic of Vietnam.

September 2, 1962 - Soviet Russia agreed to send arms to Cuba, leading to the <u>October Missile Crisis</u> after the shipments were discovered by the U.S.

September 2, 1963 - Alabama Governor George Wallace forcibly halted public school integration by encircling Tuskegee High School with state troopers.

Birthday - Christa McAuliffe (1948-1986) was born in Boston (as Sharon Christa Corrigan). On January 28, 1986, the 37-year-old high-school teacher, the first "ordinary citizen" in space, died with six crew members in the Space Shuttle Challenger explosion.

September 3

September 3, 1783 - The <u>Treaty of Paris</u> was signed by <u>John Adams, Ben Franklin</u> and John Jay, formally ending the <u>American Revolutionary War</u> between Britain and the United States.

September 3, 1833 - The *New York Sun* newspaper first appeared, marking the beginning of the 'penny press,' inexpensive newspapers sold on sidewalks by newspaper boys. The paper focused on human interest stories and sensationalism and by 1836 was the largest seller in America with a circulation of 30,000.


