TREASURER'S REPORT:

Merry Christmas everyone. Our current 2024-2025 Chapter revised end of second quarter (QTR-2: OCT-NOV-DEC) chapter account fund balances are as follows. The chapter CHASE bank account balance, as of the end of December shows us at SAVINGS - \$1,530.03 USDs / CHECKING - \$2,568.46 USDs. The Chapter AZYLC Program Fundraising Campaign US Bank account balance is \$3,603.69 USDs. All expected external grant payments and donations have been included in the balance numbers reported and have been reconciled with each banking account. On behalf of our Chapter Finance Committee, I wish to thank all those fellow companions who have donated to either or both our Chapter funding and Stand-alone AZYLC funding accounts. We want to highlight Chapter companion CWO (ret) Ted Cogut, USA for his \$300.00 USDs donation to our Chapter OPS account and for also unselfishly collaborating and participating in our Chapter fundraising efforts. We hope his admirable support of our Chapter will spread to other fellow companions. Speaking of chapter fundraising, we are very excited to share with everyone the recent legislative passing of bill H.R.1432 into law (also referred to as the VSO Equal Tax Treatment "VETT" Act). The VETT Act now allows contributions to certain federally chartered veterans' organizations (such as our MOWW IRS 501c19) to be deducted from individual or corporate income taxes as charitable contributions. If this is not a great reason to donate to our Chapter funding efforts, I do not know what is! Please consider a charitable donation contribution to our Chapter this Holiday season. ADJUTANT'S REPORT:







MONTHLY FEATURED ARTICLE

Weathermen Handled Stress

If you were an eighteen-year-old Pfc weather observer in the AAF, as I was in in the last year of WWll, it was unlikely that you might soon be briefing aircrews on their flight weather. In those days before jet-propelled aircraft, satellites, and advanced radars, the possibility of flying



above or or around weather hazards was limited. The pilot depended on the advice his weatherman gave. But within two years I was a certified weather forecaster charged with signing pilots' weather clearances. I gave them advice regarding my predicted weather hazards such as icing, turbulence, low cloud ceiling, limited visibility. The forecaster sized up the pilot. Could he handle a bad weather flight? Among the many thousands of my weather briefings, if it were a nonessential flight, only in a very few did the pilot elect not to fly after hearing my description of his flight weather. You had to be sure you were not a prophet of doom, using

words which might convince a pilot not to fly when with proper respect for the elements, there was no reason he shouldn't. Stress would be a mild word to describe it. In his few quiet moments, to introduce a bit of levity while keeping a little more sanity, subconsciously every weatherman recalled the weatherman's song, sung to the tune of *Macnamara's Band*:

"I'll never forget
The day was wet,
The general wanted to fly.
He said, 'My boy, is it okay
For me to go on high?'

When I said 'No,
It's going to snow,'
You should have seen him frown,
Say I'm the only one who ever
Kept the general down.
Teletypes, synoptic charts
Anemometers twirling around,
My pressure lines are intertwined
My fronts are underground.

I'm going to throw my books away
And use the Almanac."

Chorus: We are the men, the weathermen,
We may be wrong, oh now and then
But when you see our planes on high,
Just remember we're the ones who let them fly.

DECEMBER IN HISTORY

December 1

December 1, 1640 - A nationalist revolution in Portugal led to independence from Spain as the Spanish garrisons were driven out of Portugal.

December 1, 1822 - Dom Pedro, founder of the Brazilian Empire, was crowned as the first emperor of Brazil.

December 1, 1918 - Iceland was granted independence by the Danish parliament.

December 1, 1919 - Lady Nancy Astor became the first woman in the British House of Commons.

December 1, 1925 - The Locarno Treaties were signed by France, Belgium and Germany, as a preventitive measure to avoid another war, in the aftermath of <u>World War I</u>. Terms of the <u>Locarno Pact</u> were guaranteed by Britain and Italy.

December 1, 1941 - The American Civil Air Patrol (CAP), a U.S. Air Force auxiliary, was founded as Director of Civilian Defense, former New York Mayor Fiorello LaGuardia, signed the formal order. The CAP currently provides aerospace education, a CAP cadet program, and emergency services such as locating missing aircraft.

December 1, 1942 - The Beveridge Report was published in Britain envisioning the welfare state including insurance for the entire population.

December 1, 1955 - The birth of the modern American civil rights movement occurred as Rosa Parks was arrested in Montgomery, Alabama, for refusing to give up her seat to a white man and move to the back section of a municipal bus. Her arrest resulted in a year-long boycott of the city bus system by African Americans and led to legal actions ending racial segregation on municipal buses throughout the South.

December 1, 1988 - Benazir Bhutto was nominated to become prime minister of Pakistan, the first woman to govern a Muslim nation.

December 1, 1989 - Mikhail Gorbachev became the first Soviet Russian leader to visit the Vatican and meet the Pope, thus ending 72 years of strict atheist policy in Communist Russia.

December 1, 1990 - England was connected to mainland Europe for the first time since the Ice Age as engineers digging a railway tunnel under the English Channel broke through the last rock layer.

December 1, 1994 - The head of the U.N. Commission on Rwanda estimated 500,000 deaths had resulted from genocide.

December 2

December 2, 1804 - Napoleon Bonaparte was crowned Emperor of France by Pope Pius VII in Paris.

December 2, 1805 - Napoleon defeated Russia and Austria in the Battle of Austerlitz.

December 2, 1823 - President James Monroe introduced his "Monroe Doctrine" during his annual message to the Congress, prohibiting any further colonization of the American continents by European powers, stating, "we should consider any attempt on their part to extend their system to any portion of this hemisphere as dangerous to our peace and safety..."

December 2, 1852 - The Second Empire was proclaimed in France with Napoleon III as emperor.

December 2, 1859 - Abolitionist leader <u>John Brown</u> was executed for treason at Charles Town, West Virginia, following his raid on the U.S. Arsenal at Harper's Ferry.

December 2, 1942 - Physicists led by <u>Enrico Fermi</u> carried out the world's first successful nuclear chain reaction at the University of Chicago.

December 2, 1954 - The U.S. Senate <u>condemned Senator Joseph McCarthy</u> for misconduct following his ruthless investigations of thousands of alleged Communists.

December 2, 1971 - The United Arab Emirates was formed, consisting of seven Arab kingdoms on the eastern coast of the Arabian Peninsula including the former Trucial states Abu Dhabi, Dubai, Sharjah, Ajman, Umm al Qaiwain and Fujairah. Ras al-Khaimah became a member in 1972. The area has some of the world's largest reserves of petroleum and natural gas.

December 2, 1979 - Electors in Iran voted overwhelmingly in favor of a new constitution granting absolute power to Ayatollah Khomeini.
