#### COMMANDER'S REPORT:

As we are now firmly postured to resume our local chapter 2025 operating year (OY2025) activities, I wish to thank our chapter staff planning team for their continued efforts to keep our Santa Cruz Valley [SCV] Chapter - 193 administrative, managerial, and operational focus on track. That said, I encourage all our chapter companions to review our revised OY2025 Chapter Action Plan goals for this year and also to take a moment to review our Order's OY2025 CINC's Letter of Intent (a copy attached to the Adjutant's Report from our first RM-1 SCV Chapter-193 Regular Membership meeting at our Casa Del Rio Mexican Restaurant September business luncheon and also distributed to all our online chapter companions via electronic email coordination message) which provides the "why's and wherefores" of how the greater organizational strategic guidance and our chapter CAP goals correlate.

#### TREASURER'S REPORT:

Continuing our chapter's Treasurer's Report analysis recap from last month, our chapter had its best operating year [OY] resumption of operating year fundraising activities in its entire operational service history by having completely replenished (back to 100%) its administrative [ADMIN], operations and management [O&M], and general patriotic education [PE] funding budget sector allocations all before commencing any scheduled operations this OY. The current chapter banking account balances are as follows; regular SCV Chapter-193 CHASE BANK SAVINGS - \$1,342.65 USD, CHASE BANK CHECKING - \$2,230.02 USD. The current STANDALONE SCV Chapter-193 AZYLC Program Support US BANK non-profit checking account is at \$3,762.78 USD as of the 1-31 August 2025 bank statement – pending the deposit processing of an added \$2K USD in collected 2025 MOWW National Convention activity fundraising donations (anticipating a total bank account balance of \$5,762.78 by the end of the OY2025 first quarter [QTR-1: JUL-AUG-SEPT 2025].

#### **ADJUTANT'S REPORT:**

With the first quarter almost behind us in the next two weeks, we will be kicking off OY2025 chapter support operations with the Massing of the Colors & Service of Remembrance Ceremony [MOC] in El Paso, TX (scheduled for SAT, 27 SEPT 2025). VSO-1: WOW [W] HYB VCC MTG - AUG 2025

The Wings Over Wendy's (WOW) non-profit organization is our most expansive hybrid supported cross-state lines veterans service organizational partnership. WOW meets weekly each Monday morning at 9:30 AM (PST). While they are mostly active servicing their local community throughout central and southern California tending to food / clothing drives and planning field trips and attending special events, their meetings gathers veteran communities from over four states each week helping propagate military service heritage.

This year's 2025 MOWW National Convention was successfully hosted in Tucson, AZ, the week of 4-10 August at the Desert Diamond Hotel & Casino, which is the first such partnered event conducted on local native American Tribal Lands ever in the southwest. Our Region XIII (R-13) Santa Cruz Valley Chapter 193 in Tucson, AZ hosted the first MOWW second century of continued local community service operations just before launching this year's 2025 National Convention during the first week in August with the placement and accompanying MOWW historical marker dedication ceremony event in the town of Marana, AZ (west of Tucson) on Tuesday, the 5<sup>th</sup> of August. #### **MONTHLY FEATURED ARTICLE**

## White Wing/Masher

It began on a day in late February 1966 and continued through three-fourths of March. In a mountain fastness Americans called the "Crow's Foot," close to the place the Vietnamese called "Bong Son," the 1<sup>st</sup> Air Cavalry Division took on what was the best the North Vietnamese Army had to offer: three regiments of the NVA 3<sup>rd</sup> Division.



As soon as contact was established, UH-1 Iroquois helicopters (Hueys) with infantry aboard flew to the scene and 8-inch howitzers took to the roads. The convoy kept a tight interval between vehicles — deuce and a halfs, a threequarter ton truck, a water tank mounted on a trailer. These were the vehicles in my 13-man section. We were following self-propelled 8-inch howitzers whose tracks threw dust up from the dusty, dirt road. As they snaked through the part of the road particularly disliked - the hairpin turns and sheer cuts of An Khe Pass — which forced braking for steep downhills and accelerating for equally steep uphills, where from above NVA

could calmly aim a rifle or even roll a boulder down on us. Someone said, "if they hit that load, we won't be telling anyone about it." The load, moving along just five or ten feet ahead, consisted of olive-drab-painted, 200 pound, 8-inch rounds. Upon arrival at the battle site, the 8-inchers began a rapid and continuous fire. This was the start of the battle known as White Wing/Masher. As it progressed, flares turned part of the night into day. In an angry grinding sound, a US Air Force C-47's mini-gun painted the night with lethal pink arcs (tracer bullets). This C-47 just had to be called "Puff the Magic Dragon."

North Vietnam's massing of its army in that area had been calculated to split the country of South Vietnam in two, bringing a quick end to the South's resistance. But 1st Cav, with the help of other Free World Forces — this was a large battle elements of the US 3rd Marine Amphibious Force, the Army of the Republic of Vietnam (ARVN) 22<sup>nd</sup> Division and the Republic of Korea Capital Division, crushed those NVA dreams. #### **AUGUST IN HISTORY**

### August 1

**August 1, 1838** - Slavery was abolished in Jamaica. It had been introduced by Spanish settlers 300 years earlier in 1509.

**August 1, 1944** - Anne Frank penned her last entry into her diary. "[I] keep on trying to find a way of becoming what I would like to be, and what I could be, if...there weren't any other people living in the world." Three days later, Anne and her family were arrested and sent to Nazi concentration camps. Anne died at Bergen-Belsen concentration camp on March 15, 1945, at age 15.

**August 1, 1944** - The Warsaw Uprising began as the Polish Home Army, numbering about 40,000 Polish patriots, began shooting at German troops in the streets. The Nazis then sent eight divisions to battle the Poles, who had hoped for, but did not receive, assistance from the Allies. Two months later, the rebellion was quashed.

**Birthday** - *Star-Spangled Banner* author Francis Scott Key (1779-1843) was born in Frederick County, Maryland. After witnessing the British bombardment of Fort McHenry on the night of September 13-14, 1814, he was enthralled to see the American flag still flying over the fort at daybreak. He then wrote the <u>poem</u> originally entitled *Defense of Fort McHenry* which became the U.S. National Anthem in 1931.

Birthday - Moby Dick author Herman Melville (1819-1891) was born in New York.

#### August 2

**August 2, 1776** - In Philadelphia, most of the 55 members of the Continental Congress signed the parchment copy of the <u>Declaration of Independence</u>.

**August 2, 1923** - President Warren G. Harding died suddenly in a hotel in San Francisco while on a Western speaking tour. His administration had been tainted by the Teapot Dome political scandal and his sudden death prompted many unfounded rumors. He was succeeded the next day by <u>Calvin Coolidge</u>.

**August 2, 1939** - Albert Einstein wrote a <u>letter to President Franklin D. Roosevelt</u> concerning the possibility of atomic weapons. "A single bomb of this type carried by boat and exploded in a port, might very well destroy the whole port together with some of the surrounding territory." Six years later, on August 6, 1945, the first Atomic Bomb, developed by the U.S., was dropped on the Japanese port of Hiroshima.

**August 2, 1990** - The Iraqi army invaded Kuwait amid claims that Kuwait threatened Iraq's economic existence by overproducing oil and driving prices down on the world market. An Iraqi military government was then installed in Kuwait which was annexed by Iraq on the claim that Kuwait was historically part of Iraq. This resulted in Desert Shield, the massive Allied military buildup, and later the 100-hour war against Iraq, Desert Storm.

#### August 3

**August 3, 1492** - Christopher Columbus set sail from Palos, Spain, with three ships, *Nina*, *Pinta* and *Santa Maria*. Seeking a westerly route to the Far East, he instead landed on October 12th in the Bahamas, thinking it was an outlying Japanese island.

**Birthday** - War correspondent Ernie Pyle (1900-1945) was born in Dana, Indiana. His syndicated column offered sympathetic insights into the experiences of common soldiers during <u>World War II</u>. He received a Pulitzer Prize for his reports of the bombing of London in 1940 and later war reports from Africa, Sicily, Italy and France. He was killed by machine-gun fire near Okinawa in the South Pacific on April 18, 1945.

**Birthday** - Gray Panthers founder Maggie Kuhn (1905-1995) was born in Buffalo, New York. After she was forced into mandatory retirement at age 65, she founded the Gray Panthers organization to fight age discrimination and succeeded in the banning of mandatory retirement in most professions.

## MEET THE NEW NATIONAL LEADERSHIP



Lieutenant Colonel David J. Worley was re-elected for a second term as the Military Order of the World Wars (MOWW) National 93rd Commander-in-Chief. His 27 years in the Air Force, which began in 1975 included eight years as an enlisted FAA certified Air Traffic Controller, and after attending Officer Training School in 1983 serving as a rated Air Battle Manager. Upon his military retirement, Lt Col Worley then spent over fourteen years instructing the Air Force Junior ROTC program at Crescenta Valley High School in La Crescenta, California before retiring in 2017. Lt Col Worley holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Professional Aeronautics from Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University, and a Master of Public Administration (MPA) degree from Troy State University. Lt Col Worley is the Assistant Director for Operations at the Thousand Oaks Youth Leadership Conference (TOYLC), has been on the TOYLC staff for over 10 years, and developed the TOYLC's current curriculum. As the 93rd Commander-in-Chief of the Order, he pledges his commitment to carry-on with the five-year revitalization plan that PCINC Okin initated in 2021 and has continued under the thoughtful leadership of CINC Perez.
